



# DICHONDRA

A beautiful lawn alternative or landscaping plant that grows well in Australia.

Dichondra Seed  100%



Dichondra has dark green, circular leaves and looks beautiful in landscaped areas. It does very well in shady areas where many grasses may not grow e.g. under trees and it does not need to be mowed. Often referred to as 'Kidney Weed' because it's leaf is a similar shape. It grows across the surface area and creates a pretty trail of plant. It is best suited to areas with low levels of traffic.

## Sowing Instructions:

### PREPARE YOUR SOIL

Remove rocks, weeds and debris, ensuring good drainage through digging or aeration. Level the area, being careful not to remove too much topsoil and use good quality soil for best results.

### FERTILISE

Apply a Starter Fertiliser to the seedbed either a few days before sowing or on the same day and rake it into the soil. **Landscape KickStart Range Fertiliser** should be applied at a rate of 3kg of fertiliser per 100m<sup>2</sup>.

### SPREAD SEED EVENLY

Follow the suggested sowing rate recommended on the product. If the area is large, divide the area and seed into manageable sections for even distribution. Spread the seed across the surface at a rate of 1kg per 100m<sup>2</sup>. Gently rake to lightly cover the seed. Seed should be making good contact with the soil.

### WATERING

Don't let your seed dry out! For best results keep the seedbed constantly damp for 3 to 4 weeks using a fine spray to avoid moving seeds.

## Ideal Sowing Times:

All States

Autumn, Winter, Spring, Summer



*Dichondra requires regular deep watering in Summer to stay green.*

## Germination Guide:



Germination:  
Good, 10-14 days  
15-22 Degrees Celsius



New Sowing: 1kg per  
100m<sup>2</sup>.

Dichondra leaf gradually forms its round shape as it grows.



Dichondra doesn't require mowing, but height can be reduced by mowing as required.
